HIV is a long-term condition and thanks to the widespread availability of antiretroviral therapy, life expectancy among people living with HIV is approaching that of the general population. Yet this does not always mean years spent in good health. People living with HIV are at higher risk of developing mental health conditions and continue to experience stigma and discrimination within health systems.

**Event objectives:**

- **Raise awareness of the long-term health and wellbeing of people living with HIV** and the importance of **measuring the health-related quality of life** for people living with HIV.
- Determine **concrete actions** that European and national level policymakers can take to improve the long-term health and wellbeing of people living with HIV.
- **Launch HIV Outcomes Policy Asks** and secure **political commitment** from key institutional stakeholders to take action to improve the health outcomes of people living with HIV.
